

Getting to the LSU Campus

From I-10, take the Dalrymple exit. Turn right at the bottom of the ramp, and follow Dalrymple for 1/2 mile onto campus.

Parking

Weekday parking in the Law Center lot is no longer allowed. Limited free parking is available in the North Fraternity Lot (#3 on map) located on W. Lakeshore. However, you must first obtain a temporary permit from the Visitor Center (#9 on map). Metered parking is available in the Union Square Parking Garage (#2 on map) for \$6/day if you purchase a parking tag, in advance, from LSUcle. Please indicate your desire to take advantage of this rate by checking the appropriate checkbox on your registration form or online registration page. Otherwise, onsite parking will cost \$1.50/hour.

Free parking allowed in law lots on Saturday, on first come basis. \$40 garage parking on game day.
