Just before you get to College Drive, the lane splits again (right lane for College Drive, left lane for Constitution Ave). Get into the left lane and go straight at the traffic light, across College and onto Constitution Ave. You will see Chili's Restaurant straight ahead. Continue on Constitution Ave. for 1/4 mile.
